NEW GROUPS TO LAUNCH AT ARBY'S, FOX'S

GROVE CITY, PA --- The Men's Ministry at Fellowship Community Church is launching the first of a series of **men's groups** whose aim is to sharpen one another through the truth of the gospel.

Groups will meet on **two nights**, weekly, in two locations to better serve the congregation. Pastor Michael Frey will lead a group of men through the New Testament letter of **1John**. Pastor Bob Pazehoski will lead a second group through the Old Testament book of **Judges**.

Group meetings will focus on the Scriptures, spending a majority of the time in **discussion** (rather than a formal lesson) of a particular chapter of the Bible. In preparation each week, participants are called upon to **read** the week's chapter daily, building a familiarity to bring to the conversation. Meetings are an open opportunity to raise questions, work out details, and be encouraged through study.

Pastor Bob Pazehoski, Jr. will lead Judges.

The ideal size of a group is 3-5 men. One booth is best! Smaller groups allow every voice to be heard and every concern to be addressed while still allowing men to meet and know one another. When a group exceeds five, the aim is to split and plant a 2nd group, encouraging both to then grow again. This is a ministry of **multiplication**, not just addition!

Groups are open to **men** over the age of 17. If you are interested in participating, you can join any time! Bring your Bible and whatever is on

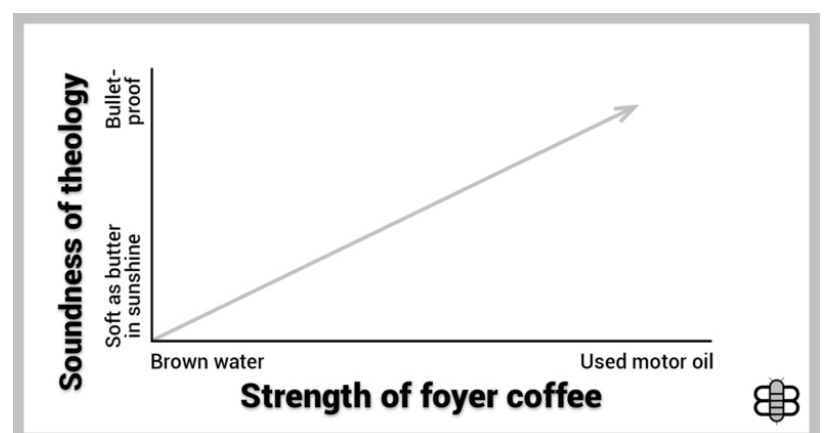

Study Finds Connection Between Strong Foyer Coffee And Sound Church Theology

US—A recent LifeWay Research Center study found an “undeniable” connection between the strength of a church's foyer coffee and the soundness of its theology, a report by the organization revealed Tuesday.

“Those churches that had coffee rated as ‘weak’ or ‘very weak’ suffered from much more watered-down, biblically feeble sermons than those that had bold coffee available in the foyer,” the report read in part. “Churches with strong, full-bodied coffee



were found to boast much more solid, well-rounded theology from the pulpit.”

According to the report, the strong correlation between the two variables suggests some kind of causation. Further, the study suggested that churches that served tea or hot cocoa in place of fresh coffee suffered from more aberrant theology than even the congregations being given watered-down cups of joe.

Churches that didn't serve coffee at all were not included in the study, as they were assumed to be either apostate, or entirely non-Christian in the first place, according to LifeWay.
